This is the perfect opportunity to exercise the core value of fraternity. Just as the Order is a family organization, we invite and encourage family members to join us in this celebration of our faith and fraternity.

Since its inception in 1979, the Knights of Columbus' Marian Prayer Program has held more than 166,900 local council and parish prayer services with some 20 million participants. This year, the prayer service is intended to raise awareness of the plight of Christians persecuted for their faith and to stand in prayerful solidarity with them. We are working with Fr. Hottovy to set up prayer services for the parish. Please be on the lookout for upcoming details on opportunities to participate in a prayer service.




