Those who wish for their departed loved ones to be remembered at Masses during the month of November should write the names on the special envelopes (from the packet) which will be kept on the altar during November. Any monetary offerings included in the envelopes will be used for Masses for the Faithful Departed.

NEW! On All Souls Day, beginning after the 8:15am Mass, there will be hundreds of candles in the sanctuary. **Come and light a candle for the faithful departed** and write down their name(s), which will be put on the altar for the month of November. *Please light no more than two candles per person. Thank you!*

Plenary Indulgence Guidelines for November 2020

In order to avoid crowds coming together and to allow participation for those staying at home, changes have been made to how one might receive a Plenary Indulgence in November 2020.

- These three conditions are the same: one must make a confession, receive communion, and pray for the Holy Father's Intentions.
- Throughout the month of Nov (the days are not limited this year), one should visit a cemetery and pray for the dead OR visit a church and recite an Our Father and the Creed there. Again, these things may be done at *any time* during Nov.
- Lastly, the elderly, the sick, and all those who, for serious reasons, cannot leave their homes, will be able to obtain the Plenary Indulgence as they join spiritually with the Faithful, completely detached from sin and with the intention of complying as soon as possible with the three usual conditions (confession, communion, and praying for the Holy Father's intentions) before an image of Jesus or Mary, recite prayers for the deceased (a rosary or chaplet, for example), or perform a work of mercy by offering to God the sorrows and hardships of their own lives.

These relics will be placed on the side-altars during November:

St. John Mary Vianney ☩ St. Frances Xavier Cabrini ☩ *Together in one reliquary:* Holy Cross, Holy Crib, St. Philip Neri, Pope St. Gregory the Great, St. Aureus, and St. Diodisus ☩ True Cross ☩ St. Benedict Joseph Labre ☩ St. Lucy ☩ **St. Frances Xavier Cabrini** was born July 15, 1850 in Italy. She founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart and wanted to go to China ... but Pope Leo XIII asked her to go to America. She became an American citizen in 1909. She died Dec 22, 1917, was canonized in 1946, and is the patron saint of Immigrants. Her feast day is Nov 13. *St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, pray for us!*
☩ **St. Jean Baptiste Marie Vianney** was born May 8, 1786 in France, the 4th of 6 children. He was raised Catholic in a time of persecution and was drafted into Napoleon's army. He deserted, entered the seminary, and was ordained Aug 12, 1815. Fr. Vianney served his people tirelessly—primarily at the parish of Ars—until his death at age 73, Aug 4, 1859. He was canonized in 1925 and is the patron saint of Parish Priests. *St. John Vianney, pray for us!*
