Those who wish for their departed loved ones to be remembered at Masses during the month of November should write the names on the special envelopes (from the packet) which will be kept on the altar during November. Any monetary offerings included in the envelopes will be used for Masses for the Faithful Departed.

Plenary Indulgence Guidelines for November 2020

In order to avoid crowds coming together and to allow participation for those staying at home, changes have been made to how one might receive a Plenary Indulgence in November 2020.

- These three conditions are the same: one must make a confession, receive communion, and pray for the Holy Father's Intentions.
- Throughout the month of Nov (the days are not limited this year), one should visit a cemetery and pray for the dead OR visit a church and recite an Our Father and the Creed there. Again, these things may be done at *any time* during Nov.
- Lastly, the elderly, the sick, and all those who, for serious reasons, cannot leave their homes, will be able to obtain the Plenary Indulgence as they join spiritually with the Faithful, completely detached from sin and with the intention of complying as soon as possible with the three usual conditions (confession, communion, and praying for the Holy Father's intentions) before an image of Jesus or Mary, recite prayers for the deceased (a rosary or chaplet, for example), or perform a work of mercy by offering to God the sorrows and hardships of their own lives.

These relics will be placed on the side-altars during November:

St. John Mary Vianney ☩ St. Frances Xavier Cabrini ☩ *Together in one reliquary:* Holy Cross, Holy Crib, St. Philip Neri, Pope St. Gregory the Great, St. Aureus, and St. Diodisus ☩ True Cross ☩ St. Benedict Joseph Labre ☩ St. Lucy

☩ True Cross & St. Helena

(Excerpt from *Taking the Measure of the Relics of the True Cross* by Thomas Craughwell published in The National Catholic Register)

According to an ancient tradition, in 326 beneath a Roman temple, excavators found three crosses, but nothing to distinguish the cross of Jesus from the crosses of the two thieves who were crucified with him. Helena had a dying woman carried to the site so she could touch each cross in turn. After touching one of the crosses, the sick woman was instantly healed, which was taken as a sign that it was the cross upon which Our Lord had died. Helena took a portion of the cross back to Rome, where she had it enshrined in the chapel of her palace (now the Basilica of the "Holy Cross in Jerusalem"). The rest of the True Cross remained in Jerusalem, in a chapel attached to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

☩ St. Benedict Joseph Labre

Throughout his youth, St. Benedict demonstrated cheerfulness and was wise for his age with a strong aversion to sin. He desired to enter a monastery but instead became a poor pilgrim, visiting holy places and shrines throughout Europe. He died April 16, 1783 in Rome (kept as his feast day), was canonized on December 8, 1881, and is the Patron Saint of Homeless People
