Those who wish for their departed loved ones to be remembered at Masses during the month of November should write the names on the special envelopes (from the packet) which will be kept on the altar during November. Any monetary offerings included in the envelopes will be used for Masses for the Faithful Departed.

- Plenary Indulgence Guidelines for November 2020**
- These three conditions are the same: one must make a confession, receive communion, and pray for the Holy Father's Intentions.
 - Throughout the month of Nov (the days are not limited this year), one should visit a cemetery and pray for the dead OR visit a church and recite an Our Father and the Creed there. Again, these things may be done at *any time* during Nov.
 - Lastly, the elderly, the sick, and all those who, for serious reasons, cannot leave their homes, will be able to obtain the Plenary Indulgence as they join spiritually with the Faithful, completely detached from sin and with the intention of complying as soon as possible with the three usual conditions (confession, communion, and praying for the Holy Father's intentions) before an image of Jesus or Mary, recite prayers for the deceased (a rosary or chaplet, for example), or perform a work of mercy by offering to God the sorrows and hardships of their own lives.

These relics will be placed on the side-altars during November:
St. John Mary Vianney ☩ St. Frances Xavier Cabrini ☩ *Together in one reliquary:* Holy Cross, Holy Crib, St. Philip Neri, Pope St. Gregory the Great, St. Aureus, and St. Diodisus ☩ True Cross ☩ St. Benedict Joseph Labre ☩ St. Lucy

Philip Neri (1515-1595) was a sign of contradiction, combining popularity with piety. He played an important role in the reform of the church. At an early age, Philip abandoned the chance to become a businessman, and devoted his life to God. At the urging of his confessor, Philip was ordained a priest and soon became an outstanding confessor himself, gifted with the knack of piercing the pretenses and illusions of others, though always in a charitable manner and often with a joke. He is one of the influential figures of the Counter-Reformation, mainly for converting to personal holiness many of the influential people within the Church itself. His characteristic virtues were humility and joy. Many people wrongly feel that such an attractive and jocular personality as Philip's cannot be combined with an intense spirituality. Philip's life melts that view away. Philip always wanted his followers to become not less but more human through their striving for holiness.

Pope Saint Gregory the Great (540-604) was the prefect of Rome before he was 30. After five years in office he resigned, founded six monasteries on his Sicilian estate, and became a Benedictine monk in his own home at Rome. At the age of 50 he was elected pope by the clergy and people of Rome. Gregory was direct and firm. He removed unworthy priests from office, forbade taking money for many services, emptied the papal treasury to ransom prisoners of the Lombards and to care for persecuted Jews and the victims of plague and famine. He was very concerned about the conversion of England, sending 40 monks from his own monastery. He introduced liturgical reforms and Gregorian chant. He sacrificed his own preferences, especially when called to be Bishop of Rome.
