Loosening Health Restrictions

While closely monitoring CDC and local health department guidelines as they are significantly loosening restrictions on gatherings during this pandemic, and working with our parish council and medical experts, Saint Teresa Parish will reinstate some aspects of the Mass that had previously been suspended. The safety of our parishioners and priests has remained the top priority of our parish leadership throughout this difficult time.

**What Will Change:
Note: These changes apply to ALL weekend Masses.**

- Holy Water is available in the fonts.
- The priests will process at the beginning and end of Mass.
- Congregational singing will be allowed (*and encouraged!*).
- Parishioners will bring up Offertory. If you would like to bring up Offertory, pick up the "Gift Bearers" card from the gifts table in the back of church and keep it with you. After the Prayers of the Faithful, come to the back of the church, replace the cards, and bring up the gifts.
- We will use the Communion Rail (and people are welcome to receive on the tongue). People who want to use the Communion Rail should use the center aisles to come forward, regardless of whether they are seated in the front or back of church. Those that prefer to receive Communion standing and in-the-hand may use the side aisles to go to the back of the church (regardless of whether they're sitting in front or in back) where this standing and in-hand reception will be the option.

What Will Stay the Same:

- If you have *any* symptom(s) of COVID—even the mildest symptom—stay at home!
- Wear a mask or face covering when you attend Mass.
- Pews and surfaces will still be cleaned regularly, and we do have an air purification system installed in the church.
- We will still social distance. That is, we will keep six feet between people or households.
- Offering: Ushers will not collect our donations. Please put your envelopes in the baskets at the exits or into the drop-slot at the rectory.
- Remember: Mass will still be live-streamed and available for later viewing.

Lenten Confession Times

Times for Confessions have been adjusted again—*more* times are available so that everyone has the opportunity to make a good confession during Lent.

Remember: confessions are still being heard in the sacristies rather than in the small transept-confessionals. The priest has his back to the entry for the privacy of the penitent, who may choose face-to-face confession if s/he prefers.

Confessions will be heard at these times:

- Before the 6:30am and 8:15am Masses every day, including Saturday's 8:15am Mass.
- Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 7pm, Fr. Ramedini will hear confessions in the back confessional.
- Saturday afternoons from 3-3:50 and again after Mass from 5-5:30
