

- Holy Water is available in the fonts.

- Congregational singing is allowed and encouraged!
- Parishioners may bring up Offertory. If you would like to bring up Offertory, pick up the "Gift Bearers" card from the gifts table in the back of church and keep it with you. After the Prayers of the Faithful, come to the back of the church, replace the cards, and bring up the gifts.
- We may use the Communion Rail (and people are welcome to receive on the tongue). People who want to use the Communion Rail should use the center aisles to come forward, regardless of whether they are seated in the front or

Catholic Social Services of Southern Nebraska

Abraham contacted Catholic Social Services requesting rental assistance after his only financial familial support died. Abraham has been disabled since 1987 and after being denied twice for disability in 1999, one of his brothers decided to take care of his rent, utilities, etc., but unfortunately, that brother passed away. Abraham has two birth defects, kidney problems, defective ribs, and spinal abnormalities. Abraham also has heart problems and a blood clot disease that requires a special machine. Right now, his sister is helping him reapply for disability benefits. He was just approved for Social Security Insurance (SSI) and will receive \$373 per month. He is waiting to hear back from Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (*formerly known as food stamps*). CSS was able to cover March rent and is hopeful he will soon be approved and provided additional financial support from SSDI that will help cover his monthly living expenses.
