Why A New Curriculum?

What is Catholic liberal education?

The term "Catholic liberal education" is simply a description of the full vision of human formation according to the mind of the Church. It is desirable and accessible to everyone who has a soul....It is liberal, in the classical sense of the term drawn from the Latin *liber*, which means free. Authentic Catholic education frees us to see the truth of things, and to order our lives and our loves to that truth. With a 2,500-year proven track record, this gold standard of education produced many of the keenest minds and the holiest saints in history. It works.
