SCAM ALERT

Phishing is not a new thing, but we've seen a recent uptick in the efforts of scammers. If your mobile number is listed on the parish website or in the bulletin, you can expect scam text messages. If your e-mail is listed on the website or in the bulletin, you can expect to receive scam e-mails. The messages will come from someone claiming to be Fr. Hottovy and asking for a favor—usually gift cards. You may simply ignore the messages or you can block the phone number or mark the e-mail as “phishing”. There is little else that can be done.

Gift Bearer Instructions

If you'd like to take up gifts at a Mass, pick up the Gift Bearer sign from the gifts table in the back and take it with you to your seat. When you come back for the gifts, bring the sign with you and leave it at the table. If no one picks up the sign before Mass begins, the ushers will ask a person or family.

Pro-Abortion Appropriations Bill

From the USCCB's Action Center:

This week, the House Committee on Appropriations will mark up the Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies (LHHS) appropriations bill, which currently excludes the 46-year-old Hyde Amendment and other longstanding, bipartisan provisions including the Weldon Amendment. Eliminating these provisions would force taxpayers to pay for elective abortions and force health care providers and professionals to perform and refer for abortion against their deeply-held beliefs, as well as force employers and insurers to cover and pay for abortion.

Congress needs to hear from you: tell Congress to keep the Hyde Amendment and other Hyde-related policies, and the Weldon Amendment in the appropriations bills, and to oppose any bill that expands taxpayer funding of abortion.

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH: INDULGENCES & RESOURCES

What is a plenary indulgence?

Catechism of the Catholic Church (n. 1471): "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints".

How do I obtain an indulgence?

Indulgences have gotten a bad rap over the last several centuries. Contrary to what rumors say, they cannot be bought or sold but can only be earned. Then the indulgence may be applied to a soul in purgatory or to one's self (but not to another living person). You may earn one plenary indulgence per day.

These instructions have been simplified. You are encouraged to read more about this. All of the normal conditions apply (confession, communion, detachment from sin). This is summarized from the National Catholic Register article, "What the Year of St. Joseph Means, and How to Gain the Indulgences" by J. Pronechen, Dec 10, 2020


1. Meditate for 30 minutes on the Our Father or be a part of a spiritual retreat that includes a meditation on St. Joseph.
2. Carry out a corporal or spiritual work of mercy.
3. Pray the rosary in families and between engaged couples.
4. Daily entrust your activities to the protection of St. Joseph and ask his intercession for those seeking work.
5. Recite the Litany of Saint Joseph for the Church persecuted
6. Recite any legitimately approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph



This is a special prayer prayed every day for 30 days.
