Pro-Abortion Appropriations Bill

From the USCCB Action Center:

WASHINGTON - Today, the House voted 219 to 208 in favor of H.R. 4502, a package of appropriations bills that currently excludes the 46-year-old Hyde Amendment and other longstanding, bipartisan provisions like the Weldon Amendment. Eliminating these provisions would force taxpayers to pay for elective abortions and would have the effect of forcing health care providers and professionals to perform and refer for abortion against their deeply-held beliefs, as well as forcing employers and insurers to cover and pay for abortion.

Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan of New York, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee for Religious Liberty, and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann of Kansas City in Kansas, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, issued the following statement:

This is partial list of the roles that need to be filled. A full, detailed insert is in the works.

Altar Server Coordinator

Frequency: every three to six months
Working with the Parochial Vicar, this person would keep a current roster of servers (with the help of your parish secretary, of course), make and distribute the server schedule, and communicate with parents and servers.

CCD Coordinator

Frequency: Start-up at beginning of school year, then as-needed.
A coordinator will make the calendar for the CCD school year, will make sure that we have teachers for each section, and will help plan events and services for the students. S/he will communicate with the parents and teachers.

CCD Teachers (Elementary)

Frequency: Once per week during the school year: Weds 4-5:30
Following an already-established curriculum, CCD teachers will teach elementary-age children who do not attend our parish school. Note: Sacrament years (2nd and 5th grades) are taught by the CK Sisters

Godteens Coordinator

Frequency: Start-up at beginning of school year, then as-needed.
This person (or couple) would work together with the Parochial Vicar to oversee the Godteens program (Catechesis for High Schoolers), create the calendar, register students, plan group-events, and communicate with its leaders, students, and parents.

Godteens Leaders

Frequency: Once per week during the school year: Weds 7:30-9pm
A leader-couple takes a class as freshmen and continues with them through the end of their senior year, teaching them about the Faith. They open their home to once-per-week meetings for high school students during the school year.

Quarterly Mailings

Frequency: a couple of hours once every three months
A 700 piece mailing is prepared and mailed quarterly. Your assistance with a small group would be welcome in preparing these mailings.
