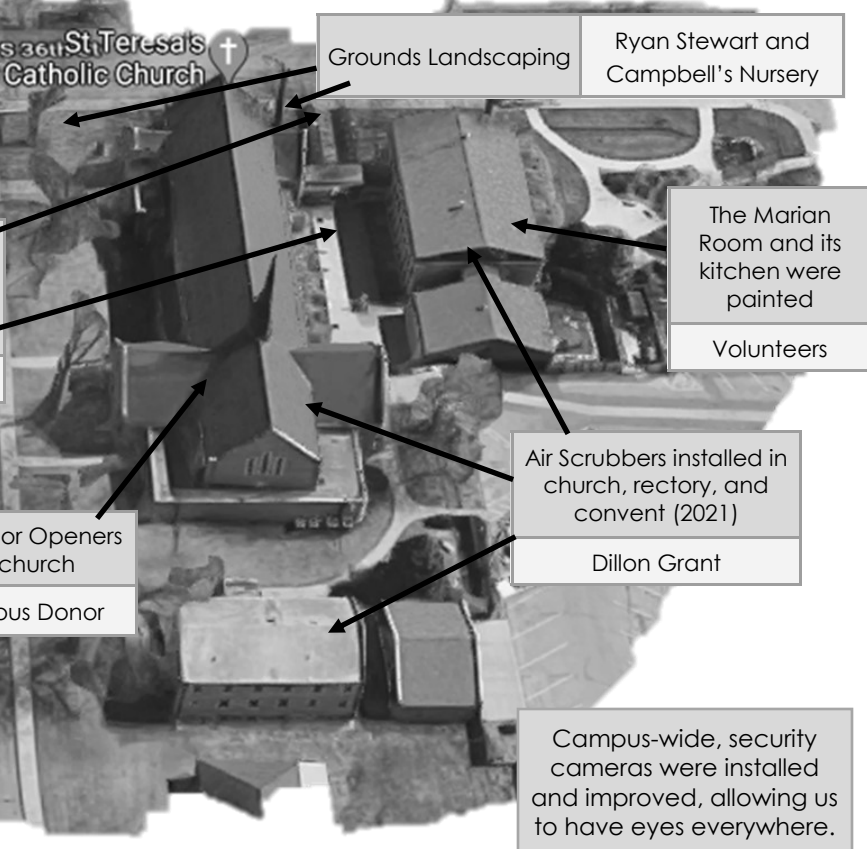

ST. TERESA MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The Master Plan for the St. Teresa campus was created in 2014 -2015. It was the result of a two year effort to gather insight and ideas from parish members and various parish organizations. The Plan looked at the whole campus including the church, school, convent, rectory, and two houses owned by the parish. The Plan has helped guide over a dozen major improvements during the past six years.

Several main recommendations from the 2015 Plan were realized, including renovations to the convent and church, expanding the school playground & parking lot, relocation of the Thrift Store, and numerous improvements to the school including new heating & air conditioning.

Now it is time to *update* the Master Plan. There were several recommendations such as enlarging the narthex, adding handicapped accessible bathrooms for the church, improving the rectory and further renovations at the convent that were not yet realized.

To guide this effort, Father Hottovy established a Master Plan Update Committee. The Committee is looking at capital improvements to the campus buildings and parking lots. This effort doesn't look at the many parish programs, but instead the physical buildings that house these parish programs and activities. The goals for this Committee include:

- Solicit input from parish members
- Update and prioritize the Master Plan
- Develop cost estimates for all elements
