# sacred art spotlight

## The Wedding Feast of Cana | 1563

Paolo Veronese represents the New Testament water-into-wine miracle of Jesus in the grand style of the sumptuous feasts of food and music that were characteristic of 16th-century Venetian society. The wedding banquet is framed with Greek and Roman architecture from Classical Antiquity with rows of Doric and Corinthian columns surrounding the courtyard.

The lower-half of the painting contains 130 human figures invited to celebrate the bride and bridegroom at their wedding feast. Among the wedding guests are historical figures, such as the monarchs Eleanor of Austria, Francis I of France, and Mary I of England, and the Holy Roman Emperor Charles V. There are also contemporaries of Veronese: noblemen, poets, architects, painters, and diplomats. Veronese included himself as the musician in a white tunic, who is playing a viola.

In the wedding banquet, the holy guests and the newlyweds have exchanged their social status, and so Jesus, the Virgin Mary, and some of his Apostles, are seated in the place of honor at the center of the banquet table, while the bride and bridegroom sit, as guests, to the left at the far end of the table.

Above Jesus, a carver is carving a lamb, which prefigures his sacrifice as the Lamb of God.

Veronese brilliantly paints the different parts of the miracle all in one scene. In the bottom right, a barefoot wine-servant pours the new, red wine into a serving vessel, from a large, ornate stone jar, which earlier had been filled with water. In the bottom left, the steward of the house (dressed in green) supervises the servant-boy offering a glass of the new, red wine to the bridegroom, the host of the wedding feast.
