

St. Mary and St Joseph Missionary Cooperative Projects

Due to the pandemic, missionaries have not been allowed to travel internationally to ask for our much-needed help. The Diocesan Mission Office instead asks that we select charitable projects to support through the Propagation of the Faith Website, *missio.org*. We have selected three projects, described below:

1. **The Sisters of Saint John the Baptist in Antananarivo, Madagascar** wish to build a **drinking well** for the community. In search for water, many young and old walk long distances to collect water. These challenges affect many aspects of family life, as sometimes, head of households are forced to leave children tending other children in order to gather water. The unreliability is alarming and causes despair. Please help! As little as \$25 would restore health and spirits!
 - a. Goal is \$5000. It is 66% raised so far!
 - b. Let's try to raise the final \$1,724 for this project to help the Sisters get drinking water for their community in Madagascar.
 - c. Go to missio.org under donate select category "water" to see pictures.

2. Within the **Catholic Diocese of Kigoma in Tanzania** there are two centers that have a total of **553 children who have been left without parents**. Either one or both parents died of HIV/AIDS. Having been left on their own by their impoverished extended families, these children end up looking at the Church as their existing mother and father. At the centers, we need to assure these children receive **three hot meals per day and address their academic and health issues** even as the country faces the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as many other tropical diseases. The diocese is confronting the lack of funds and the high level of poverty of the people.
 - a. Goal is \$10,000. It has only 2% raised so far.
 - b. Let's try to help them get closer to their goal for this project to help the HIV/AIDS Orphans in Tanzania.
 - c. Go to missio.org under donate tab select category "children" to see pictures.

3. **Sister Mary Chilengwe, of the Sisters of Child Jesus, in the Archdiocese of Kasama** in Zambia runs a farm to help care for their local community. The congregation has continued serve the people during this challenging moment. Now, they shell corn by hand, and it would save time and effort if they could secure a diesel-powered machine. This new equipment would be made by a local manufacturer in Kasama, Zambia who provides other farmers with similar industrial tools. Given electricity challenges in the farm, a diesel powered sheller is the most economical and practical. Sister Mary and her team know that this added help would enable them to offer more of their time for pastoral services and providing resources. A gift of \$25 can help buy diesel filter oil.
 - a. Goal is \$1,000. It has only 15% raised so far.
 - b. Let's try to help them raise the last \$850 to help Sister buy a corn sheller and fuel.
 - c. Go to missio.org under donate tab select category "agriculture" to see pictures.
