The St. Vincent de Paul Society (SVDP) was created in 1833 by Blessed Frederic Ozanam. It is a Catholic lay organization inspired by Gospel values. Members work together to offer financial assistance and fellowship locally to people who are in need and suffering in our community.

The St. Teresa SVDP Conference is the newest in Lincoln and its members continue the long tradition of witnessing God's love by embracing works of charity and justice. Assistance is offered to people of all faiths -- as Vincenians see the face of Christ in everyone.

What We Do:

St. Teresa SVDP members are "boots on the ground" that provide emergency relief for the needy, including funds for things such as food, rent, utilities, car repair or other needs to help those working through a challenging time. Assistance often means a struggling individual or family can avoid being evicted or having their electricity, heat or water service disconnected. By visiting people in need in their homes, we are the walking gospel to others by our actions, time, and prayers.

100% of all contributions go directly to help individuals or families in need in Lincoln. Administrative expenses are nominal and are paid by St. Teresa's SVDP members.
